- **National Crime Victims' Rights Week is about honoring victims of crime and educating the community about victim's rights. This year's theme is "New Challenges - New Solutions."**
- **18.7 million people nationally are affected by crime each year.***
- **50% of violent crimes are not reported to the police.***
- **Over 1 million violent crimes occur in public schools each year and fewer than 30% are reported.***
- **Crime can have financial, emotional, and psychological consequences that extend far beyond its immediate victims. Crime affects the victim's family, friends, and entire community.**
